The 3D Design Quest: Imagination Unleashed – New!

Have you wondered: How does 3D printing work? Could you print objects in 3D that your mind conjures up? This course is a hands-on journey in design learning especially crafted for Honors students from diverse fields, introducing them to the art and science of 3D design and printing. It emphasizes project-based learning and ownership, where students will actively apply principles of 3D modeling to bring their imagination to life. Through a series of hands-on projects, participants will explore the potential of 3D design in life and academics while getting familiar with the popular tools and techniques. Each project encourages creative thinking and problem-solving, allowing students to build a portfolio that showcases their unique talents.

Guide to a Good Life: Stoic Philosophy and the Good Life

In this course, we will examine the fundamental concepts of Stoicism from ancient times to modern interpretations and receptions. We will read original texts in translation along with modern interpreters and receptions. Course is focused on discussion, interpretation and application of philosophical ideas. Our main question is "what does it mean to live a good life?" Each student will develop their own philosophy of life through our study of Stoicism (this philosophy need not be Stoic!).
