Course Description:

This course introduces basic safety and health information for entry-level workers in general industry. Students will explore common workplace hazards, understand workers' rights and employer responsibilities, and learn the procedures for filing complaints. Through discussions and case studies, the course aims to equip students with practical knowledge to navigate and promote safer working environments. This seminar-style course emphasizes collaboration and critical thinking, preparing students to take control of their workplace safety and influence safety culture effectively.
